And it is on this Main Stage that the no-longer-so-young Firenze Jazz Festival shows its ambition to "challenge" the landscape of international jazz festivals, featuring Alfa Mist in his only Italian date, Coca Puma, Bassolino, and the legendary Planet Funk (returning to Florence for the first time since before the pandemic), along with Alabaster DePlume and the Orchestre Tout Puissant Marcel Duchamp for the free closing party on Sunday, September 14.

There's more: starting this year, the Festival has its own campground, which will also host two free concerts. We've established a new partnership with at - autolinee toscane, welcomed Volotea as an official travel partner, and received the support of Consorzio Chianti Rufina, Car Village, and more than 20 other organizations.

Connected is this year's theme, and the spirit of connection is both talked about and felt throughout this edition. A festival that belongs to everyone and strives to build bonds with everyone: musical, human, and geographic connections are increasingly woven into this living creation that has become one of the key events of the Florentine Summer, and today, more than ever, is aiming for the future.



The **Vocal Blue Trains** are a polyphonic vocal group of 30 singers and musicians, founded and directed by **Alessandro Gerini**, an Italo-Polish singer, vocal coach, and arranger. A multifaceted ensemble that combines the choral imprint of gospel and traditional polyphony with the modern sounds of electronic music and ambient house.

They have gained national and international attention thanks to important collaborations with Italian and international artists such as **Ultimo**, **Paul Phoenix** from the King's Singers, **Gigi Proietti**, **Sergio Sylvestre**, and **Modà**, performing in over 200 concerts across Europe and Asia. They have stood out in international festivals such as the Wien International Festival, the Jeju Choir & Symposium, the Pistoia Blues Festival, and the Moscow Sounds Festival, where they were the first foreign choir to win the "Best Overall Performance" award

In 2022, they released their first self-titled album with Black Candy Productions, available on all platforms. The tracklist includes songs by artists such as **Leonard Cohen**, **White Stripes**, **Justin Timberlake**, and **Drake**, reinterpreted in an electronic pop style. The group has also released five official videos, including covers of "Smells Like Teen Spirit," "Lonely Boy," "Cry Me a River," and "Hotline Bling."

# Isaiah Collier Parallel Universe

Innovator Isaiah Collier is opening new horizons in the continuum of jazz. A saxophonist by training, his multi-instrumental talents and compositional skills have pushed the boundaries of the genre: Parallel Universe represents a new chapter in his musical journey.

Having already collaborated with a wide range of musicians such as Chance The Rapper, Wadada Leo Smith, Chicago's "queen" of jazz Angel Bat Dawid, and his band The Chosen Few, Collier's latest work as a bandleader explores the shared musical heritage of the African diaspora with a grace and confidence that transcend his young age. Embracing the risk and vulnerability of live performance, Collier and his band tuned in to the frequencies of improvisation that fueled many of jazz's most timeless recordings. "Recording direct-to-disc gave me a truly fortunate opportunity to experience what our musical predecessors, almost a hundred years ago, had to face", he explains. References to Sun Ra, Ras G, J Dilla, Fela Kuti, Miles Davis, Gil Scott-Heron, Whitney Houston, Aaliyah, and Frankie Knuckles appear in the opening of Parallel Universe, envisioning a genreless musical lineage that resonates with the polyphony of stories his band brings to the stage, from Chicago and beyond.

Featuring soul-gospel singer **Jimetta Rose**, AACM trumpeter and former Art Ensemble of Chicago member **Corey Wilkes**, blues guitarist **Michael Damani**, and longtime collaborators **Julian Davis Reid**, **James Russell Sims**, and **Micah Collier**, the eight-track album vibrates with love and deep understanding among musicians at the peak of their artistry.

Freedom of Movement. Article 13 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights recognizes the freedom of movement and residence within the borders of each state. Through movement, the human being—migrant by nature—has formed new communities, founded cultures, invented trade, and exchanged techniques and customs. Francesco Astore, Director of the FJF, together with author Francesco Sorelli, engages in conversation with Tommaso Rosa, Director of Marketing & Communication at – autolinee toscane.



With the reading of 1984 by George Orwell, Giuseppe Culicchia – Italian writer, essayist, and translator – makes use of the soundtrack specially composed by Giorgio Li Calzi to offer the audience an invitation to read (or reread) a book that, as the years go by, has paradoxically become increasingly relevant. What was defined upon its release in 1948 as a dystopian novel set in the future is today a disturbing allegory of our present: and in the story centered on the protagonist Winston Smith, there are many elements that make us reflect on what we are currently experiencing.

Giorgio Li Calzi, trumpeter, music producer, and sound experimenter among the most eclectic on the contemporary scene, has collaborated with international artists such as Wolfgang Flür (Kraftwerk), Arto Lindsay, and Lenine. He is a cultural promoter (CHAMOISic and Torino Jazz Festival from 2018 to 2022) and creator of innovative performative projects, including concerts for dogs and humans on stage, and for an extra-species audience. Among his most recent works are albums like Italiani with Gian Luigi Carlone and Johnson Righeira, and Music for writers, produced by the Turin International Book Fair.

She is not afraid of being in a place that isn't hers, because she belongs nowhere. She is not afraid of being alone. Mahthildis: from maht meaning "strength," "power," and hild meaning "battle." She is Matilde: strong warrior. To my father, for teaching me to be a free woman."

Two of the most eclectic musicians on the Italian scene join forces, merging their creativity for a one-of-a-kind concert: an unconventional duo playing with the balance between melody, rhythm, harmony, and electronics. Driven by curiosity and a shared desire to explore different musical landscapes with lightness are freedom, the two musicians linger in each territory before setting off together on new sonic paths, letting the music itself guide their journey.

Gianluca Petrella is one of the most internationally renowned Italian musicians. A trombonist, composer, and producer, he won Down Beat magazine's "Rising Stars" Critics Poll for two consecutive years. In over 20 years of career, he has collaborated with world-famous artists such as Enrico Rava, Sun Ra Arkestra, Carla Bley, Paolo Fresu, Pat Metheny, Manu Di Bango, Matmos, DJ Ralf, Villalobos, and Nicola Conte. He has recorded for labels including ECM, Blue Note, Schema, and !K7, and in 2009 he founded his own label, Spacebonice, Records. His music moves seamlessly between jazz, electronics, and interdisciplinary experimentation, also contributing to cinema, theater, and dance projects. He currently leads the projects Cosmic Renaissance and Trio 70's, and collaborates regularly with Jovanotti, Pasquale Mirra, and DJ Gruff.

**Pasquale Mirra** is one of the most active and acclaimed vibraphonists on the Italian and international jazz scenes. He studied at the Conservatories of Salerno and Bologna, also attending Siena Jazz workshops. He was awarded "Best Italian Vibraphonist" by Jazz It magazine for three consecutive years and was ranked among the best Italian musicians by Musica Jazz.

He has recorded over 30 albums and played with artists such as Fred Frith, William Parker, Rob Mazurek, Hamid Drake (with whom he has collaborated continuously since 2008), Ballaké Sissoko, and Nicole Mitchell. Since 2015, he has been a member of the band C'mon Tigre, touring worldwide. He also contributed to the soundtrack of Woody Allen's film To Rome With Love with the band Mop Mop.

A dream in music, a dream set in Jewish Italy, in its memory and tradition. A project dedicated to dialogue and encounter: to valuing difference as a fundamental tool for building a culture of peace, something all the more necessary today, in a time of conflicts that are spilling blood across Europe and the Mediterranean.

The project's aim is to tell, through its own personal musical language, the story of the Jewish soul, often hidden yet deeply embedded in Italian history. Using a contemporary musical language, shaped by the individual paths of each member, it portrays a "world apart," as Italian Judaism has often been described.

In this project, Enrico Fink, one of the very few interpreters of Italian Jewish tradition outside the strictly synagogue context, with countless projects ranging from the most philological to the most boldly contemporary, is joined by Gabriele Coen, whose highly acclaimed work as a composer and interpreter of Mediterranean Jewish tradition has earned him international stature, and Zeno de Rossi, a central figure in the new Italian jazz scene and also a co-creator, together with pianist Alfonso Santimone and saxophonist Francesco Bigoni (recently appointed director of Siena Jazz), of jazz reinterpretations of Jewish musical material.

# David Krakauer Acoustic Klezmer Quartet

**David Krakauer**, one of the most important and influential musicians in contemporary Jewish music and a central figure in the new wave of klezmer, is best known for his amplified sound that pushes the boundaries of klezmer by incorporating elements of jazz, rock, funk, and hip-hop.

In this program, Krakauer presents acoustic versions of his original compositions, blended with classic pieces from the traditional klezmer repertoire. It is a unique opportunity to experience Krakauer's distinctive sound up close and in an intimate, fully "unplugged" setting. The audience will witness Terkish Yale V'Yove Tanz and the extraordinary musical connection among these musicians, with whom David has played for many years.

As Judy Gelman Myers wrote for the New York Press: "Throughout history, Jewish tradition has reinvented itself wherever it has taken root – from Babylon to Cordoba, from Bessarabia to New York – whether in exile or by free choice... David Krakauer has become the embodiment of this spirit of reaffirmation, wherever it leads him and his clarinet."

The Luca Gelli Organ Trio was formed in 2021 from the encounter between Luca Gelli (guitar), Manrico Seghi (Hammond organ), and Giovanni Paolo "JP" Liguori (drums). Their shared passion for jazz and blues flows into a repertoire of standards and original pieces, honed through continuous live performances. In 2022, they launched a project dedicated to the music of Wayne Shorter.

The album "Shorter Notes" was released by Dodicilune in October 2024. It features well-known compositions such as Speak No Evil and Yes or No, as well as lesser-performed pieces like House of Jade and Fee-Fi-Fo-Fum. The arrangements were curated by Luca Gelli. Among the guest musicians is **Dario Cecchini**, a saxophonist who seamlessly adapted to a repertoire that moves from swing to shuffle, with touches of rhythm'n'blues. Their on-stage chemistry continues to shine with strong cohesion and energy.



# Feel Good Productions DJ Set

From the hills of northwestern Italy, Feel Good Productions have been making the world dance since 1995 with their unique mix of global beats and urban grooves. Founded by DJs/producers Julian (Funky Farmer) and Pony (Rider), the duo began with legendary farm parties before establishing themselves as pioneers of the global beat scene.

Among the key milestones: the Asian Underground collective in 1997 and the success of The Feel Good Vibe in 1999, which dominated MTV and was used in advertising campaigns. Since 2005, they have founded the label Green Queen Music and curated acclaimed compilations like This is the Sound, Mad World and Funkadelica 2. blending Balkan, funk, and electronic influences. Since 2014. DJ Pony Montana has taken the project worldwide, becoming a regular presence at festivals such as Glastonbury, Boomtown, Fusion, Sziget, Boom Festival, and many more. He continues to perform internationally, curate events, and produce new tracks for Green Queen Music, blending cumbia, funk, Balkan sounds, and powerful bass.

From underground raves to the world's biggest stages, Feel Good Productions and DJ Pony Montana continue to unite cultures and make the world dance - one bassline at a time. In April 2025, their new album was released as a tribute to their musical roots: The Wizard of Coconut. The result is a heady, warm and funky global mix of Jamaican, Cuban, Ghanaian, Nigerian, Moroccan, and Latin American beats and rhythms, all produced with that classy, smooth, and organic style that these Italian tastemakers are famed for.

Francesco Cangi & The Lonely Rockets is the first project as a leader by the trombonist and multi-instrumentalist from Florence Francesco Cangi, leading a power trio composed of Antonio Amabile on keyboards and synths and Donald Renda on drums.

The debut album What if the Universe..? features tracks entirely composed, conceived, and played by Francesco Cangi: a project born from the need to express his musical identity in a context full of influences, merging advanced jazz training and a strong pop rock background, in search of a unique, distinctive, and catchy sound. With the participation of great guests such as Riccardo Onori, Dario Cecchini, and Sabina Sciubba, and with the artistic collaboration of his brother Samuele Cangi, What if the Universe..? includes tracks ranging from instrumental new jazz to electronic funk, contaminated by the massive use of synthesizers, powerful melodies, robust brass section, and lots of groove: always and rigorously at the service of music.

# La Paranza Del Geco Danze Infuocate del Sud

An engaging show that intertwines songs, music, and dances from the **popular tradition of Southern Italy**, born from oral transmission and collective memory. **La Paranza del Geco** leads the audience on an exciting sonic journey through the hypnotic rhythms of the tarantella: from the driving sounds of Irpinia to the tammurriata of the Vesuvian area, from the pizzica tarantata of Salento and the Murge to songs and sonëtte from Gargano, from the "sonu a ballu" of Aspromonte to the tunes of Cilento, and even partnered dances like the Sicilian waltz, Lucanian pastorals, and Brindisi scozjie. A concert that awakens all the senses – to be experienced and danced.

Sounds, dialects, ancient instruments, and vibrations that take us back to the time of Magna Graecia, the Messapians, and the Latins, the common roots of **all Mediterranean cultures**; to the time of ritual festivals linked to the lunar calendar and the cycles of sowing and harvest, to the festivals dedicated to Mother Earth, to Carnival, and to "iatromusical" therapies that healed the bite of the "tarantula."

Founded by **Simone Campa** – multi-instrumentalist and current artistic director of the company – **La Paranza del Geco** is today a national point of reference in the field of traditional music, with over 1,000 concerts in more than 25 years of activity. Through vibrant shows and performances, the group spreads and renews the artistic and musical traditions of Southern Italy and the Mediterranean area, moving naturally between world music and bal folk, in a continuous artistic and cultural exploration.

Letizia aka La Ponto, a chemist by choice and DJ by chance, grew up in Southern Italy surrounded by jazz, blues, and b-movies, falling in love with Italian soundtracks and black music. Her sets weave together sonic storytelling, rare grooves, and musical modernism—spanning clubs, radio, and stages—always driven by passion.



Neapolitan by birth and ideals, also known as Dario Bass, **Dario Bassolino** is a pianist, producer, and composer active on both the national and international jazz-electronic (and beyond) scene. He has worked on productions with **Nicola Conte, LNDFK**, and **Pellegrino**, among others. He has collaborated with Nu Genea, Kurt Rosenwinkel, Jason Lindner, Asa Chang, Pink Siifu, Chester Watson, Paolo Fresu, System Olympia, Ghemon, Fitness Forever, Giuseppe Vitale, Stefano Costanzo, Pasquale Mirra, Voodoo Kid, Missey, and many more. Bassolino is his new solo project.

On March 1st, he released his first album: Città Futura. The soundtrack to an imaginary film populated by gangsters, fortune-tellers, and "crooner-style" singers. It's animated by voices from bustling city squares and by a sound projected toward the stars yet firmly rooted in sun-scorched earth. An album full of groove, with a "dark, pulp, grotesque, and romantic" sound, it draws on the past to design a new, visionary "future city."

Co-produced with **Paolo Petrella**, the album features an impressive lineup of singers and musicians — including **Linda Feki** (LNDFK) and **Andrea De Fazio** (Parbleu, Nu Genea) — who interact while preserving their individual identities. Through mantric percussion and Arabic melodies, urban blues and cinematic atmospheres, sonic hallucinations, neomelodic tributes, and orchestral discofunk, the six tracks unfold into what Bassolino himself describes as an "enigmatically pop, prog-influenced, jazz-funk-rooted" album. A work that proudly claims the affirmation of a "southern" sound — in its sociological sense — instead of the overused "Mediterranean" label.

Cap always pulled low over her eyes, a metropolitan attitude, and a soul deeply resonating with Nature — **Coca Puma** is a sort of urban fairy, capable of illuminating every object touched by her artistic gaze. A demiurge who sketches sonic architectures with the freedom of an abstract painter, an antenna that tunes in to the moods of the forest one moment and the asphalt the next, reverberating them into a new musical cosmogony.

Born in 1998 and based in Rome, Coca Puma is the moniker of **Costanza Puma**, an eclectic artist with a **nu-jazz** background who moves within a hybrid and unconventional horizon, blending dream pop, nu-soul, electronic, ambient, and post-rock. Ethereal and magnetic, she uses her voice and the textures of her productions to build a world entirely her own. A deep-rooted passion for Brazilian music and a more recent exploration of electronic music converge in her DJ sets and in her interest in the relationship between sound and image

After several important experiences on stages in Rome and beyond, on April 19 she released her first solo album: **Panorama Olivia**, the result of a creative drive that foregrounds the research and experimentation she has carried out in recent years.

# Planet Funk

Founded in 1999, for 25 years **Planet Funk** have been one of the most important acts on the international electronic and dance music scene, thanks to their distinctive "collective" nature and the successes they've achieved over the years. The group was born from the fusion of **Souled Out!** (Domenico "GG" Canu and Sergio Della Monica) and **Kamasutra** (Marco Baroni and Alex Neri). The band's name, "Planet Funk," comes from the title of an old track by Alex Neri himself.


With their show, they celebrate the unmistakable sound that has defined them since their iconic Non Zero Sumness. In the setlist of this multi-platinum collective, alongside their classic hits, there will also be their new single "I GET A RUSH," released in early June (Wisemama/The Orchard). It's a significant track, dedicated by Alex Neri (DJ, keyboards, synthesizer, sampler), Marco Baroni (keyboards, piano, synthesizer, programming), Dan Black (vocals and guitars), and Alex Uhlmann (vocals and guitar) to their friend and bandmate Domenico GG Canu, who passed away prematurely.

Vinyl enthusiast, DJ, and artistic director, Gambo has performed across Europe and founded labels such as Land Of Dance and Musica Altra. Creator of the Jazz is Dead! festival, he has been active in Turin's cultural scene since 2010 with the TUM project.



Gus Fairbairn, aka Alabaster DePlume, has a pocketful of phrases that he uses all the time whether he's walking down the street or holding court with musicians and an audience. For a long time the Mancunian would tell anyone who'd listen that they were doing very well. More recently, it's another phrase which has a similar effect and which belies his unwavering commitment to personal vulnerability and collective politics: "Don't forget you're precious."

A process that is people-first not product-first ensures that the music is unique; often gem-like. Alabaster DePlume's songs are built on sonorous circular melodies and luminous tones that transmit calmness and generosity in warm waves – unless they're raging against complacency and the everyday inhumanity of end times capitalism. Most importantly, he brings a valuable transparency to his work. "This is what I'm really doing," he says. "I want to talk about why I'm doing this, and how I'm doing this. Poet, saxophonist, and icon of the new British jazz scene, he presents A Blade Because A Blade Is Whole with his ensemble, released in March on International Anthem.

My life in Italy. A conversation with content creator Kacie Rose. Originally from Michigan, Kacie moved to New York to pursue her dream of dancing professionally - a journey that eventually led her to Venice and finally to her ultimate destination: Florence, Tuscany. It's been a varied and colorful path for Kacie Rose Burns, a hugely popular content creator, who has made Italy her home. Today, she's turned her passion for discovering beautiful corners, incredible hidden gems, and, of course, the most delicious Italian restaurants into a full-time job.

### h 10.30 pm

Orchestre Tout Puissant Marcel Duchamp is a constantly evolving orchestra, inspired by the great African groups of the 20th century - such as Tout Puissant Orchestre Poly-Rythmo de Cotonou - and by the revolutionary French artist Marcel Duchamp. Founded in Geneva in 2006 at the initiative of double bassist Vincent Bertholet. Orchestre Tout Puissant Marcel Duchamp began as a sextet ("a rock band with a marimba," as Bertholet describes it), with a name that pays homage both to African orchestras and to Dada art, thus meraina a Third-Worldist and ecological spirit with a deliberate resistance to schemes, conventions, and genre labels.

In 2016, on the occasion of the project's tenth anniversary, the decision was made to expand the band to an XXL format. Over time, the line-up settled at 12 members: double rhythm section, double bass, two marimbas, two cellos, violin, horns, guitars - and everyone sings.

Their latest album is titled Ventre Unique, released in October 2024 on their now long-time cult label/laboratory Bongo Joe Records, following the acclaimed We're Ok But We're Lost Anyway. Once again, it carries a strong political and social message, in the name of collective experience and the unifying power of music.


Peter Bernstein, a key figure on the New York scene, has collaborated with legends such as Sonny Rollins, Lonnie Smith, and Brad Mehldau. Roberto Gatto, one of the most influential Italian drummers, boasts an international career alonaside artists like Chet Baker, Michael Brecker, and Joe Zawinul. Lanzoni, a refined pianist and composer, won Top Jazz as best new talent and today explores the Hammond with a personal and contemporary language. Alessandro Lanzoni graduated in piano in 2012 with top marks, honors, and special mention from the Cherubini Conservatory in Florence, and in 2015 obtained his Master's Degree in Composition and Jazz Arrangement from the same Conservatory. Lanzoni can be considered in every respect a talented and virtuosic musician, possessing an exceptionally advanced technique; even at a young age, he has already performed on top stages and boasts national and international collaborations of the highest level. "Jungle Duke", Silvia Bolognesi's most recent project dedicated to Duke Ellington, focuses on a specific historical period of the "duke's" production. For this new adventure, **Silvia Bolognesi** has put together a combo of musicians and friends from different generations, featuring a special quest: the saxophonist **Achille Succi**.

Marco Maccarini, presenter, author, and radio host, leads the main stage of the Festival.

He began his television career on MTV, hosting cult shows such as SELECT from the London studios and TRL – Total Request Live, where he met international music guests daily and drew crowds of teenagers. He has hosted and written for numerous formats, including Say What?, MTV on the Beach, Comedy Lab, MTV Sports, YO MTV Raps, Best Driver, Web Chart, School In Action, and many others. He hosted two editions of Festivalbar, was part of the cast of Le lene, appeared in the Sanremo After-Show, and has been repeatedly invited to serve on expert juries. He was a vocal coach in the singing category of the fifteenth edition of AMICI by Maria De Filippi. On the radio, he has hosted programs on RIN, Radio Monte Carlo, R101, and Radio Italia. In his book "Un decimo di te" ("A Tenth of You"), he writes about his passion for long-distance walks and the significant transitions in his life.

During the main stage dates, a free shuttle service will also be activated from and to hu Firenze Certosa campina in town and Impruneta.



#### BY TRAM

The tram is one of the cheapest and fastest ways to get around Florence. To reach the Parco delle Cascine, where our main stage is located, just take line T1 and aet off at the Cascine stop.

#### BY CAR

Want to come by car? In this case, we recommend electric vehicles such as BYD, which supports us together with Carvillage Firenze. and keeps you safe from the ZTL (limited traffic zone), often active in downtown Florence. If possible, it's best to avoid parking in the historic city center. If you want to reach the Oltrarno district, we recommend the Oltrarno - Calza parking lot. If you prefer to arrive at Cascine, you can park at Porta al Prato - Leopolda and walk a few minutes. Alternatively, you can try parking at Piazzale delle Cascine, but be careful: it could be very crowded.

### **ACCOMODATION**

The official hospitality partner of the Firenze Jazz Festival 2025 is hu Firenze Certosa camping in town, the perfect choice for those who want to combine music, relaxation, and contact with nature.
